

BYE-LAWS OF THE ISLE OF MAN YACHT CLUB

1. The club premises shall be open as directed by the directors
2. Unless otherwise determined by the directors, with the approval of the Licensing Authority, the permitted hours of the club for the sale of intoxicating liquor, music and dancing shall be 11.00am until midnight 365 days a year.
3. No intoxicating liquor shall be sold, supplied to or consumed by any person under the age of 18 years.
4. Intoxicating liquor shall be supplied and consumed only in the following places: the bar, the adjacent balcony and the clubroom in conjunction with a meal or as the directors may authorise.
5. **Guests.**
The introduction of non-members to the club as guests under Article 18 of the club's Articles of Association is subject to the following restriction and regulations. Unless as provided for by Section 53 of the licensing act 1995 (Amended 2001).

The directors may prescribe the periods when the club is open for the admission of guests. Members may from time to time during such periods introduce guests to the club but no member on any one occasion shall introduce more than two guests.

A guest shall be accompanied by the member concerned. The guest's name and address shall be entered in the book provided and each entry signed by the member.

No person shall be introduced as a guest into the club who has been expelled from or refused membership or whose conduct or presence in the club is considered by the directors objectionable or prejudicial to the interests of the club.

The directors may refuse to admit any guest who, in their opinion, is being invited so frequently as to cause an abuse of the hospitality of the Club.

Guests shall leave the club at or before the departure of the member introducing them.

Ordinary, Overseas, Honorary, Temporary and junior members may introduce guests, but no guest normally resident in the Isle of Man may be introduced more than six times in any one year.

6. Dogs or other pets shall not be introduced to the club premises.
7. Any member or guest who, in the opinion of any director or person responsible for the bar, is considered to be behaving in a disorderly way, consumed excessive amounts of alcohol or using offensive language shall be requested to vacate the premises at once. The person concerned will then be dealt with in accordance with Rule 15 in the club's Articles of Association.
